## **10U A - FACTS SHEET**

TUITION	Team Tuition: \$2,350 (minimum roster size: 11 skaters and 1 goalie; maximum roster size: 15 skaters and 2 goalies; goalies may receive a 25% discount if two goalies are rostered)  A \$500 non-refundable deposit is due at signing with the balance paid in installments by November 1, 2024. Tuition includes practices, games & tournaments, coach stipend & travel expenses, administrative expenses and overhead. Refunds are defined in the player agreement and only issued for catastrophic circumstances as determined by the Ogden Jr Mustangs. The program may, at its discretion, prorate the tuition to determine the refundable amount, if any. Player Releases, from the OJM program, are not eligible for refunds. The cost of soft goods is not refundable.
ICE	Approx. 65-75 hours practice ice (approx. 2-3 per week), approximately 40 games per season. Practices will be at the Weber Ice Sheet, 4390 South Harrison Blvd., Ogden, Utah.
TRAVEL	Travel A teams will travel to three to six out of state tournaments. Travel includes league events, tournaments & weekend series events. Player and family travel is not included in tuition. Players are expected to travel to all team tournaments.
SOFT GOODS	Soft goods (uniforms & team gear) are not included in tuition. Players are required to buy team jerseys, pant covers, gloves, socks, track suit, shorts and t-shirt. Other soft goods may be requested by the coach. Samples for sizing may be available during tryouts. Orders must be placed by a parent. Costs can range from \$0 for returning players to \$400+ for player new to the Jr Mustangs. Soft goods will be invoiced separately from the Tuition fees.
COMPETITION	Teams may compete in the Rocky Mountain Hockey Federation as their primary league and may participate in the local travel league (UTHL) at the discretion of the Head Coach. The head coach will establish the tournament and game schedule.
EXPECTATIONS	Players are expected at all events. There is no discount for missing a tournament, game series or team event. Players are expected to respect the game, teammates, coaches, officials, opposing players, and facilities. Parents and guardians are expected to act with utmost character and to abide by the USA Hockey Codes of Conduct. Parents are responsible for the conduct of their player(s). Parents must abide by the 24-hour rule when communicating with coaches. Parents are expected to respect one another, let the coaches coach, make timely payments toward their player's account, be supportive of the program, the players, opponents, volunteers, and the game officials. The team's communications tools are for team business only and not to be used for other purposes.
ADDITIONAL COSTS	Any costs associated with additional tournaments, showcases, games, etc. that are not in the team's budget (for example, qualifying for an International Silver Stick Final or choosing to extend the season with an additional tournament or series of games) will be split among parents who voluntarily choose to attend the additional events.
